PLAYERS

Barrenechea, Agustin: Played two seasons (2007 & 2008) with the Edmonton Eskimos after being traded to the Edmonton Eskimos from the Ticats on September 11, 2007 along with a fourth-round selection in the 2008 CFL Canadian Draft in exchange for DB Jason Nedd.

Floyd, Otis: Played his rookie season (2000) with the Edmonton Eskimos after signing with the team on July 26.

Hudson, George: Played two seasons (2000 & 2001) with the Edmonton Eskimos after being selected in the third round (17th overall) of the 2000 Canadian College Draft, he signed with the team on September 13.

Murphy, Montez: Played one season (2008) with the Edmonton Eskimos.

Thompson, Chris: Played one season (2007) with the Edmonton Eskimos after signing as a free agent on August 31.

COACHES

Marshall, Greg: Marshall served five seasons (2000-04) as the Edmonton Eskimos defensive coordinator and defensive line coach. In 2003, Marshall's defence played an integral role in the Eskimos Grey Cup championship, leading the CFL in fewest points allowed (367), fewest points per game allowed (20.4 and fewest touchdowns allowed (37).

Miller, Brad: Miller served as a defensive assistant for four seasons for the Edmonton Eskimos, before being named the team's defensive coordinator and assistant head coach in 2000. Miller also oversaw the Eskimos defensive line in 1996, when Edmonton recorded the third-highest quarterback sack total in CFL history.

On Pace For 1,000

With 23 receptions for 301 yards so far this season, Ticats receiver Chris Davis is on pace to finish the year with 1,083 receiving yards. Running back DeAndra Cobb, with 325 rushing yards in four games, is on pace to run for 1,381 yards.

Players of the Week

Two Ticats were honoured for their efforts in last Friday's 30-18 win over the B.C. Lions. DeAndra' Cobb (167 rushing, 27 receiving, 2 TDs) was named the CFL's Offensive Player of the Week while linebacker Jamall Johnson (10 DTs, 1 sack, 1 FF) was named the CFL's Defensive Player of the Week.

Fourth Quarter Shutouts

The Tiger-Cats defensive unit has been clamping down on opposing offences this season. The Ticats have shut out their opponents in the fourth quarter in four of the team's five games this season, allowing only 14 points to the B.C. Lions in Week 2.

Strong Finishers

The Ticats are outscoring opponents 58-31 in the second half this season.

Markeith Knowlton

Ticats linebacker Markeith Knowlton has been responsible for four of the team's 13 takeaways, with two interceptions and two forced fumbles, including last week's crucial goal line play against the Lions.

Tackling at a Record Pace

Ticats linebacker Jamall Johnson has recorded 34 defensive tackles in three games, an average of 8.5 tackles/game. If he maintains this pace, he will finish the season with 144 defensive tackles, enough to break Calvin Tiggle's CFL's Single-Season Defensive Tackle Record (129) as well as Zeke Moreno's Ticats single-season record (114)

Porter – Rushing Yards

Tiger-Cats quarterback Quinton Porter currently leads all CFL pivots and ranks seventh in the league with 214 rushing yards after three games.

Acquired: Signed as a free agent on June 27, 2009.

2009: Was released by the Blue Bombers on May 15.
